We will be celebrating **Reconciliation Ministry on Sept. 20 & 27**. This is a chance for us to reflect on our church's commitment to ending racism, and to commit financially to that work. The theme this year is "The Rocks are Crying Out: Show Up, Stand Up, Speak Up," based on Luke 19:39-40.

We are delighted to announce that the **Rev. Sheila Spencer**, Acting President of Disciples Home Missions and a PSWR native, will be our guest (video) preacher for the first Sunday of our Reconciliation emphasis. Tesa Hauser will then wrap it up for us by preaching on Sept. 27. This is a pivotal moment for the church to respond to the call to dismantle racism. From My View at the Table

Dear Church,

Well, it's official: we're settling in for the long haul. It is entirely possible that within days or even hours of my writing this that the Governor and our County will allow churches to hold indoor gatherings again. But it is just as likely, if not more, that once those restrictions and others that will be relaxed now that we're off the State's watchlist are removed, our infection rates will rise again. Through numerous conversations with various groups of leaders within our congregation, it has become clear that Vista La Mesa wants to take a cautious approach. We will not resume gatherings simply because we are allowed to; we will resume when the situation has shifted, whether because of an available vaccine or other changes that lower risk. While that isn't a fun place to be, it's a bit relieving not to be wondering if things could change every couple of weeks.

Because we are committed to continue worship as a mostly virtual experience (with the occasional outdoor service), we want to make sure it's reaching as many people as possible. It's clear that many of you aren't fully engaging with our worship kit. We need to hear from you. Can you imagine something else working better for you? Are you getting what you need? What could we improve? Over the next few weeks, we will be trying to find ways to connect more of our congregation more effectively to our weekly worship opportunities.

It's hard to be church without being able to gather. It's hard to stay connected when we can't see each other face to face. But there are countless ways to do this differently. They will take some getting used to, but it will be worth it, so that we'll still have this amazing church family to reunite with once we get together again some day!

ZOOM TIPS

You can use Zoom from a computer or from your telephone. From your phone, you will only be able to hear people. From your computer, you'll be able to see people (but you can choose not to have your video on, if you're "not fit for public" at the moment). If you haven't tried it yet, we hope you will, as it is proving very helpful in keeping our community connected!

There are multiple ways to connect to a Zoom gathering. Contact Pastor Rebecca for the one-click link, the Meeting ID and pass code, and/or the numbers to call in from your phone. The login information can also be found in our weekly emails.

Pro Tip #1: Find "Gallery View" in the top right corner, and use it instead of "Speaker View". You'll see everyone at once, instead of just the person talking at the moment.

Pro Tip #2: It is easiest for everyone to hear if people keep themselves muted when not talking. You can mute yourself by clicking on the microphone icon till there's a red line through it. Clicking again will unmute you. Sometimes the host mutes you if necessary as well.
