From My View at the Table

Dear Church,

You may have heard people talking about the pandemic we're living through using the word "apocalyptic". When we look at all the curve balls 2020 has thrown our way, it can certainly feel like an apocalypse! But it's important to remember that apocalypse doesn't just mean "the end of the world". An earlier, less used meaning of apocalypse is "revealing". And this pandemic has definitely revealed a lot!

One of the things that has become very clear over the last 10 months – something we already knew but often forget the significance of – is how closely connected we are to fellow human beings all around the world. When the virus first emerged, we tried to close borders, as if that could contain the illness. We soon learned more than most of us ever wanted to know about global supply chains.

Given all of that and the political turmoil our nation is experiencing, we thought it was a good time to remind ourselves of what our faith says about how we are to treat others. Every other person in the world fits into one or more of the following categories in relation to you: family, friend, neighbor, stranger, and/or enemy. The Bible has something to say about how we treat all of these different kinds of people. In our fall sermon series (10/11-11/15), we will be exploring how Christian faith teaches us to deal with all of them. I hope you will tune in every week!

WE WANT TO ZEE YOU ON ZOOM!

Now that we're going to move worship to Zoom, it's even more important that everyone learn how to use it! If you would like assistance getting Zoom set up on your computer, please let Pastor Rebecca know, and she or Tesa will come to your house, with safety precautions, to help you get started.

You can use Zoom from a computer or from your telephone. From your phone, you will only be able to hear people. From your computer, you'll be able to see people (but you can choose not to have your video on).

There are multiple ways to connect to a Zoom gathering. Contact Pastor Rebecca for the one-click link, the Meeting ID and pass code, and/or the numbers to call in from your phone. The login information can also be found in our weekly emails.

For worship, we will be controlling the experience a little more than we do in meetings and other gatherings. Those who are not speaking will be muted, and the person speaking will be "spotlighted" so they are the focus on everyone's screen.

Pro Tip #1: Find "Gallery View" in the top right corner, and click it to see everyone at once, instead of just the person talking at the moment.

Pro Tip #2: It is easiest to hear if we all mute ourselves when not talking. Click on the microphone icon till there's a red line through it. Clicking again will unmute you. Sometimes the host mutes you if necessary, as well.

BIBLE STUDY

Our Zoom Bible study on the book of Hebrews continues this month. Michael Kinnamon is leading sessions every Sunday at 9 am. There are also occasional "recap" sessions, led by Tesa Hauser, on Wednesdays at 6 pm (9/30, 10/14 & 10/28).

We are learning that the concerns of the writer of Hebrews are often quite different than ours, but that we can learn a lot from considering our faith from this perspective. The discussions are rich and interesting, and they will be even better with you there! Join us!
