### **Advent-at-Home Kits**

Our Elders & Deacons are in the process of delivering Advent-at-Home Kits to the members of each flock. We hope your kit will help you engage with the season, in unity with our congregation. Each kit includes an Advent devotional written by our General Minister & President Terri Hord Owens and an abstract (square!), paper Advent wreath with five tea lights to place on the purple, pink, and white squares. We hope you will join us for worship on Zoom each Sunday at 10:30 am and light your candles as we light the ones on the Advent wreath at church. We hope you'll enjoy the daily devotionals and join us for the candle lighting services, which are at the back of the booklet.

## **Covid Christmas Catharsis**

Our Longest Night service is usually held to make space for people who are struggling with the holidays because of grief, job loss, family estrangement, mental heath challenges or other personal reasons. This year, the holidays are hard for us all! So we have adapted this service to make space for everything we're dealing with.

On Saturday, December 5th, from 10 am till 3 pm, we will have prayer stations set up in the prayer garden to help you process all the feelings this rotten year has created. Entrance to the garden will be limited to 2-4 people at a time. Masks are required.

## Caroling Parties!

Since outside is the only place we can sing together right now, we're doubling down on Christmas Caroling this year! We'd love to have you join us. On Sundays, Dec. 6th & 20th, we will meet in the church parking lot at 2:00 pm. We will provide a list of destinations with addresses and directions as needed, plus a song sheet. We'll all travel in our own cars, spread out across each house's front yard, and sing! Be sure to wear your mask to keep your neighbors safe.

### CHRISTMAS EVE (WE NEED YOUR HELP!)

It's sad to not be able to safely gather in our dimmed sanctuary on Christmas Eve to hear the story of Jesus' birth and how it changed the world. We've done our best to adapt our traditions in ways that will help all of us feel the wonder of the season, even though we're scattered in our own homes.

We are in the process of creating a Christmas Eve video service, which we will distribute early on the 24th, so you can watch it whenever it fits into your celebration. But we need your help with the video. In the Advent Kit you should have received, there are some "Christmas Eve" candles for each person in your household. Please dim the lights, light your candles, and take pictures of yourselves holding them. Then email those pictures to Pastor Rebecca by 12/14, so we can include you in the "Silent Night" circle!

We will also have a Christmas Eve Fellowship Zoom at 6:00 pm on 12/24, so you can wish your fellow VLMers "Merry Christmas!"

Dear Church,

And suddenly, Advent is upon us! In some ways, the past nine months have been one long Advent season; there were moments when it seemed like waiting was the only thing to do. Time got a little fuzzy, with the days running into one another. ## WE WANT TO ZEE YOU ON ZOOM!

Now that we're going to move worship to Zoom, it's even more important that everyone learn how to use it! If you would like assistance getting Zoom set up on your computer, please let Pastor Rebecca know, and she or Tesa will come to your house, with safety precautions, to help you get started.

You can use Zoom from a computer or from your telephone. From your phone, you will only be able to hear people. From your computer, you'll be able to see people (but you can choose not to have your video on).

There are multiple ways to connect to a Zoom gathering. Contact Pastor Rebecca for the one-click link, the Meeting ID and pass code, and/or the numbers to call in from your phone. The login information can also be found in our weekly emails.

For worship, we will be controlling the experience a little more than we do in meetings and other gatherings. Those who are not speaking will be muted, and the person speaking will be "spotlighted" so they are the focus on everyone's screen.

Pro Tip #1: Find "Gallery View" in the top right corner, and click it to see everyone at once, instead of just the person talking at the moment.

Pro Tip #2: It is easiest to hear if we all mute ourselves when not talking. Click on the microphone icon till there's a red line through it. Clicking again will unmute you. Sometimes the host mutes you if necessary, as well.

Welcome Saturday We are continuing to offer as much as we can to our Welcome Saturday guests, with careful precautions. But that means no Christmas waffle bar! We're hoping you'll help us create a little holiday cheer by bringing in homemade cookies the week of Dec. 6th.
