FCLM Dialogues on Race

The Faith Coalition of La Mesa, of which Pastor Rebecca is a founding member, is offering an 8-week class on race and racism, from a Christian perspective. The class will be held on Zoom, on Wednesdays from 6:00-7:15, starting April 14th. The only cost is \$10 for the book. Each week, we will cover one chapter (12-15 pages), which you should read ahead of time. The class will be facilitated by Melissa James & Antoine Cummins. Most of the time will be small group discussion, with groups of people from the different participating congregations. The other FCLM churches are The Table UCC, First UMC-La Mesa, Foothills UMC, and Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran.

~ ENDURE ~ LENT 2021 AT VLM

Our theme for Lent this year is ENDURE, with a different word focus for each week: Empathy, Needs met, Determination, Understanding, Resilience, and finally for Palm Sunday, Excitement. This theme is borne of a recognition that the past year has felt, in some ways, like one long Lent. Though the end of the pandemic is still a ways off, it's in sight in ways we couldn't have even imagined a year ago. We want to use this season to call to mind and heart the practices that will help us get through. We encourage you to use the ENDURE journaling worksheet that was included in your Lenten kit, to work through these ideas for yourself.

We anticipate holding a Holy Thursday service on Zoom, Thursday, April 1st at 6:00 pm. And then, for Easter Sunday, we will be back at Harry Griffen Park for a celebration.

Week of Compassion & Easter

We set a goal of raising \$500 for Week of Compassion in our annual offering this year, plus the change we collect in our coin boxes. Thank you for your help in meeting that goal! We hope you will keep collecting coins in your WOC boxes and bring them to the Park each first Sunday for our "noisy offering".

From My View at the Table

Dear Church,

During the very first Lent we went through together, nine years ago, I did a sermon series that was inspired by our name. "Vista La Mesa" is a great name for a congregation centered around the Lord's Supper. Whether you translate that "view of/from the Table" or "Table View Christian Church", it says something important about our perspective. Despite each sermon being a collaborative effort with a different group within the congregation, I think there were a couple people who were actually concerned the new pastor was trying to change the church's name! I promise I wasn't; it was just that, as a newcomer and a lifelong Disciple, I found the connection interesting as soon as I learned the name. It is also the inspiration for the name of this column! (Had you noticed that before?)

As I was reflecting on that today, it occurred to me that our experiences of the past year have shifted our understanding of what "table view" might mean. It's always had the potential to be both about what it means to view the Table as the center of our shared faith life and about what it means to view life and God's world from our places at Christ's Table. But now that the tables in our homes – the kitchen table, the coffee table, the tray table – have become Christ's table, as we share in worship remotely, our "view" of what it means to be a table-centered church has also been broadened. Ironically, being forced to scatter to our separate homes has shown us how the connections this Table makes manifest do not depend on sharing the Bread of Life across the same physical surface. This experience has given us new views and perspectives on what it means to have a Table at the center of our life together and how God intends for us to go forth from that Table into the world in service. At least, that's what it looks like from where I'm sitting!

WE WANT TO ZEE YOU ON ZOOM!

Now that we're going to move worship to Zoom, it's even more important that everyone learn how to use it! If you would like assistance getting Zoom set up on your computer, please let Pastor Rebecca know, and she or Tesa will come to your house, with safety precautions, to help you get started.

You can use Zoom from a computer or from your telephone. From your phone, you will only be able to hear people. From your computer, you'll be able to see people (but you can choose not to have your video on).

There are multiple ways to connect to a Zoom gathering. Contact Pastor Rebecca for the one-click link, the Meeting ID and pass code, and/or the numbers to call in from your phone. The login information can also be found in our weekly emails.

For worship, we will be controlling the experience a little more than we do in meetings and other gatherings. Those who are not speaking will be muted, and the person speaking will be "spotlighted" so they are the focus on everyone's screen.

Pro Tip #1: Find "Gallery View" in the top right corner, and click it to see everyone at once, instead of just the person talking at the moment.

Pro Tip #2: It is easiest to hear if we all mute ourselves when not talking. Click on the microphone icon till there's a red line through it. Clicking again will unmute you. Sometimes the host mutes you if necessary, as well. We Want to Zee You on Zoom!
