Dear Church,

The video for this year's Pentecost Special Offering references the Apostle Paul's words from 2 Corinthians 4:8, when he writes that "we are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair." We can only imagine the sort of persecution the early Christians went through, but all the same, that line about being "perplexed, but not driven to despair" feels pretty timely.

It's remarkable how things can be so hard and so exciting at the same time. The world is on fire, and we're struggling as a congregation. It's okay to be perplexed; we live in complicated times. We continue to learn how to live out gospel love, as long as we keep our hearts open to the Spirit. The One who is doing a good work here among us is faithful. Let us rejoice and give thanks for the future that God is unfolding.

As of June 4th, we will have a new pastor on staff! Our former Ministerial Assistant Tesa Hauser, by virtue of her ordination and a promotion, will become our Associate Pastor.

This is an important transition, so we have been working out the details very carefully. You will see her referred to as "Pastor Tesa" in our publications, and we encourage you to call her that. (We need to help her get used to it!)

Tesa will continue working around 12 hours a week, but after July 1st, when the new position officially kicks in, her time will be allocated a little differently. She will be present and working in worship 2 or 3 Sundays a month, to better reflect her quarter-time commitment. This was the original plan for her position but the pandemic and Zoom tech needs got in the way of that. Now that we have more folks trained to run Zoom, we can give her the flexibility originally intended.

Tesa's new position also enrolls her in our denominational Pension Fund and provides for two small reimbursable expense accounts. She will also have a column here, starting in July!

We are delighted to have Rev. Walter Zuniga preaching for us on Sunday, June 19th. Walter is relatively new to the Disciples, but he's been pastoring for over 40 years. He is the founding pastor of City Church, a new Disciples congregation currently nesting at Pacific Beach Christian Church.

Report from the Board

The Board met on Wednesday, May 25 on Zoom to address the business of the congregation. Parts of the meeting were aimed at preparing for the congregational meeting on June12th. The proposed budget was reviewed, discussed, and ultimately, approved contingent upon mutual approval from the Memorial Endowment Committee (for the proposed draw).

The Board also received a joint motion from the Personnel Committee and the Pastoral Relations Committee to award Pastor Rebecca an additional two weeks of "restorative leave," during which she is authorized to use a portion of the current sabbatical fund for costs associated with spiritually restorative activities, in order to maintain her emotional and spiritual health.

Pentecost Special Offering

We will be receiving the Pentecost Special Offering on May 29 & June 5. This over-and-above offering goes to support New Church Ministries within the Christian Church, including within the Pacific Southwest Region. We've set a goal of \$500 for this offering this year. Offering Envelopes

Offering envelopes for the new year will be arriving soon. Watch for announcements about when and where to pick yours up. If you need your envelopes delivered, Pastor Rebecca will be in touch once they're here.

We only having monthly envelopes now, because our order for weeklies wasn't big enough for a print run. You can always use a "no name" envelope though, if you need an extra!

Is It I, Lord?

Have you been feeling like you might be ready to get more involved at VLM? Beyond the elected roles the Nominating Committee calls people into, there are many other ways to serve, especially on Sundays.

As the new ministry year begins, this is a great time to try out a new role. Let Pastor Rebecca know if you're interested in any of the following:

Worship Greeter – hands out bulletins & welcome packets 10-10:30 on Sunday mornings, usually serves one particular Sunday each month

Lay Reader – reads the first scripture reading in worship, on a rotation with variable frequency (usually no more than once every two months).

AV Tech – wakes up the AV system on Sunday mornings (9:30 or so) and gets everything ready, flips the slides during worship, and then puts everything away; currently once or twice a month.

Zoom Tech – hosts our Zoom congregation, including letting people in, recording the service, monitoring the chat box, sharing prayer concerns, and shifting the camera angles; no more than once a month.

Offering Counter – work with a partner to log and count the Sunday offering; once a month (must be approved).

Coffee Hour Host – set up coffee hour, bring things out to the garden, help clean up; you can help anytime, just come on into the kitchen and volunteer!
