From My View at the Table

Dear Church,

Because of the spiritual practices traditionally associated with Lent – fasting, confession, repentance, reflection and so on – we often think of it as a solemn and even difficult season. But it's also true that the name, the word "Lent" comes from the same root as "lengthen" and refers to the fact that (in the Northern hemisphere), the days are getting longer again. Lent is, at some level, Christian spring.

And yet, the season is clearly not about flowers blooming or birds singing. We'll have plenty of time for all that during Eastertide. The "springtime" of Lent is more about the work that the seed is doing while it's still underground.

Paul writes in First Corinthians 15:36 that "what you sow does not come to life unless it dies." The little seed is buried under the dirt and must allow its seed pod to be broken open before the tiniest little stem can begin to work its way to the surface.

Such an understanding of Lent feels like it speaks to where we are at VLM these days. Things are pressing in from all directions – grief, clean-up from the break-in, concerns about who will answer the calls of the Nominating Committee, and honest anxieties about our future. But the dirt that surrounds a seed is not just a barrier, but also the grounding that will nourish the plant as it grows. The pain of the seed pod breaking open is part of growth. The rain that threatens to wash us away is also one of the things that keep us alive.

For Lent this year, perhaps we can pray with the imagery of a seed ALMOST about to break through to where the sun shines.

Security Updates

As you have likely heard by now, our church office was broken into the night of February 19th. As far as anyone could tell, the intruders did not enter any other part of the building. It appears they gained entry by picking the lock on the outside office door. Some of our electronic equipment was stolen, along with the locked box containing all our keys. Because of this, we are in the process of having all the outside doors re-keyed and/or upgraded. The outside office door is currently bolted shut, pending an upgrade to its latching system. All doors that were opened with the outdoor master have already been re-keyed. If you need a key to the building, please see Pastor Rebecca or our secretary Krista Trimlett. Supplies are limited so distribution will be prioritized, but we will make copies as needed.

Later this month, the Board will be discussing our security measures and deciding what sorts of additional precautions we want to take. As you can imagine, there are numerous expenses involved in the recovery from this break-in. Unfortunately, they are likely to come in just under our insurance deductible. However, we are blessed to have investment funds that will make it possible to cover these costs without taking away from our ministry.
