Sunday Morning Study

First, we will spend 3 weeks looking at the book of Daniel, an example of apocalyptic literature (May 14-28). Pastor Tesa will get us started on that.

Then, in June, we will explore the book of Ecclesiastes, with Pastor Tesa wrapping things up on the 18th. Our rotation of wonderful teachers will fill in the four weeks in between.

Our Study won't meet on June 25, because of a potluck that day. We will take a break over the summer and start back up in September.

From My View at the Table

Dear Church,

Every once in a while, when I'm weary of dealing with what I need to be dealing with, I start thinking about one or another of my "crazy ministry ideas." These are things like brunch church or weekly afternoon drop-ins at "grandparent church" for high school students. But there's another one that's been on my mind lately: the Mutual Hassle Help Clinic.

The idea behind Mutual Hassle Help Clinic is that dealing with the bureaucratic hassles of our own lives (insurance company, food benefits, Social Security, etc.) drains us of life, energy and everything good. These systems are literally set up to deal with us as numbers rather than people. So a Mutual Hassle Help Clinic would pair us up together, and invite us to help one another deal with the faceless, unhelpful voices on the other end of the phone, with the goal of getting stuff done with our humanity intact. Some of us are better at being polite but insistent than others; some are bolder about asking for what's needed and cutting through the red tape. The church has not traditionally seen these talents as spiritual gifts, but when used in the service of others' humanity, they certainly qualify!

In light of our office break-in in February, I'm sure you can imagine why this has been on my mind! That said, one of the best antidotes to the weariness caused by bureaucratic hassle is gratitude. As we finally emerge on the other side of this chapter, I want to extend DEEP THANKS to some of the folks who helped us through: Tesa Hauser, Krista Trimlett, Scott Tiemann, Julie Germain, Susan Peterson, John & Jennefer Lehton, Karen Cliffe, Helene Sisneros, Jim & Mary Alynn Fallon, Cathy Mullican, and the rest of the Board & MEC.
