A LOVE LETTER TO VLM

FROM KAREN CLIFFE

What are the first words that come to mind when you think about VLM? For me, that is an easy question – FAMILY.

My family first came to VLM in the late 1970's, when my parents went through a "church phase." My dad had been involved with a Disciples church in college (where he met Dick and Noralea Penny!!), so choosing VLM wasn't difficult. Though my parents moved out of the church phase pretty quickly, my two older sisters kept on attending. At the time, I was attending an Episcopal church with my best friend. The Episcopal church did not have a youth group, and so at some point I started going to beach days with the youth group at VLM. Ultimately, I ended up at VLM with my sisters. This is, of course, where I first met the Cliffe family, including my future husband, Tim. But back to the word FAMILY. In 1985, Tim and I were married here at VLM, and in 1993 we brought our first child, Brittany, into the world and into the church FAMILY. In 1996, our son Micah joined us, and the rest is history.

Raising our children here at VLM has been one of our greatest joys. Here at VLM our children learned what I had learned – that the word FAMILY means more than just mother, father, sister, brother, aunt, uncle, grandma, grandpa, etc. FAMILY can be so much more expansive and inclusive. The relationships my children developed with folks like Paul & Lavina Epler, Ed & Anita Gurling, Jerry & Norma Bailey, George & Elaine Bailey, Grace & Al Van Winkle (and the list goes on...) demonstrated to them that making real, long term connections with folks who are different from you (in age, in experience, in so many ways) enriches your life in ways you may not even recognize at the time. This has been the case not just for my children, but of course for me as well.

Now, to be clear, just like relationships within the nuclear family, relationships with the church family are not always easy or comfortable. There have been tensions, times of difficulty and pain, but way more times of joy and love. And so I will end my love letter here – with the emphasis on love. This church FAMILY has given my family so much – and it is a joy and honor to be part of this community. Love you all!

Report from the Board

The General Board met on May 24th, primarily to prepare for the annual Congregational Meeting on June 11th. The Board approved the proposed budget for 2023-2024 and received the report from the 2023 Nominating Committee. Both will be sent to the members of the congregation soon.

The Board also received reports from our pastors, committee chairs, and others. Pastor Tesa Hauser has officially announced her impending resignation at the end of 2023. (See page 2 for more.) Personnel Chair Mary Jane Fay reported on the review process that happened this spring and ongoing efforts at state-required trainings. The Worship Committee reported that, due to decreased participation, the weekly worship flower arrangements will only continue through the rest of 2023. Special arrangements will be encouraged, as desired.

Is It I, Lord?

Have you been feeling like you might be ready to get more involved at VLM? As the new ministry year begins, this is a great time to try out a new role. Let Pastor Rebecca know if you're interested in any of the following:

Worship Greeter – hands out bulletins & welcome packets 10-10:30 on Sunday mornings, usually serves one particular Sunday each month

Lay Reader – reads the first scripture reading in worship, on a rotation with variable frequency (usually no more than once every two months).

AV Tech – wakes up the AV system on Sunday mornings (9:45 or so) and gets everything ready, flips the slides during worship, and then puts everything away; currently once or twice a month.

Zoom Tech – hosts our Zoom congregation, including letting people in, recording the service, monitoring the chat box, sharing prayer concerns, and shifting the camera angles; currently once or twice a month.

Offering Counter – work with a partner to log and count the Sunday offering; once a month (must be approved).
