Dear Church,

What is your favorite line from the 23rd Psalm? There are a lot of good ones to choose from, but I think mine is where it says that God 'restores my soul.' That's where my heart goes when I hear the term "restorative leave," which I did back in May when the Board voted to grant me an extra two weeks off, for "restorative leave," with the aim of giving my soul the space needed to recover from the stresses of 2.5 years of pandemic ministry.
